## OUTCOMES-BASED PLANNING & EVALUATION

For many, outcomes measurement may have been first imposed by a funder, but effective outcomes-based planning and evaluation can be a powerful method for continuous program improvement and sustainability. During this two-day institute, participants will gain a better grasp of the “mysteries” of outcomes evaluation and clarify jargon; have opportunities to identify program outcomes; and practice ways of integrating outcomes-based thinking into day-to-day practice. Ultimately, participants will be able to implement what they learn into continuous improvement in their organizations by learning how to identify, measure, understand, and communicate program outcomes.

Participants will be provided with tools to analyze collected data both to improve program quality as well as communicate impact.

This institute is ideal for persons who have some experience with outcomes and currently are responsible for developing and articulating program outcomes.

## MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAMMING INSTITUTE

Afterschool program providers can contribute greatly to the successful passage of youth through the middle school years. However, to succeed, providers must envision their programs as separate and unique from elementary and high school age models. In this three-day leadership institute, participants will examine the components of middle school programming with the goal of understanding and championing approaches expressly designed for meeting the needs of middle school youth.

Topics include strategic marketing to the middle school “customer” with lessons and applications from the business world; connecting program design to adolescent development; and identifying the key attributes and skills required to work with this age group and how to best develop them in staff.

## RUNNING A FIT PROGRAM *A health and fitness institute for afterschool leaders*

Afterschool programs are ideally suited to address the health issues and challenges of today’s youth, particularly those from low-income communities. In this two-day institute, participants will have the opportunity to better understand youth health issues, assess their current program, and identify curricula and strategies to strengthen program offerings.

Participants will conduct an environmental audit of their programs to examine the messages and attitudes being communicated as well as the resources being offered.

Participants will then explore proven approaches to address fitness, nutrition, and healthy lifestyle that can be easily incorporated into existing program design. All participants in the institute will receive a copy of The Afterschool Kitchen Crew, a guide to healthy snacks and afterschool nutrition activities.

## ALL TOGETHER NOW *Creating an inclusive, multicultural, multi-religious program for youth, staff and families.*

In a multicultural, multi-religious society, how do you create inclusive and engaging programs? How can you provide opportunities to learn about and celebrate the cultures of all program participants? Are your books and materials academically and culturally appropriate? How does your personal perspective affect the choices you make in curriculum, activities, and staffing?

Participants in this institute will learn how to answer these questions and more, while exploring the impact of addressing multiple identities; examining important aspects of multicultural theory; and studying the Seven Principles for Inclusive Education. Participants will learn how to assess their environments for multicultural and multi-religious exclusion and inclusion and work to design an action plan for implementing new activities, new training experiences for staff, and new opportunities for involving parents and caregivers in programming. All participants will receive a copy of Tanenbaum’s Interreligious Understanding Guidebook.
